




#1 - Jesus is our pattern in His fervent, frequent, and prolonged prayer to His Father.

- B. Christ's prayers were often in response to a specific need or trial.
- C. Christ exemplified the model prayer that He taught.
- D. Our Lord's requests were characterized by two focuses.






- #2 Jesus is our pattern in His studious personal study of the Scriptures.
- A. From His earliest years, He took every opportunity to learn the Scriptures (Lk 2:46).
- B. Yet Christ's primary teacher was the Holy Spirit (Jn 7:15).
- C. Through His study and the Spirit's instruction, He could combat Satan's attacks (Mt 4:1-11).











#4 – Jesus is our pattern in His willingness to suffer to accomplish God's will.

A. It was part of the Father's plan for Him (Lk 24:46; Acts 3:18).

B. It is the expectation for His disciples (1 Cor 8:17; Phil 1:29; 2 Tim 3:12).
